MATERIALS AT THE LBJ LIBRARY PERTAINING TO ALLIANCE FOR PROGRESS

Note: The Alliance for Progress was under the jurisdiction of the Agency for International Development (which was under State Dept). Also, the multilateral organization, the Organization of American States, included the Inter-American Economic and Social Council under the Alliance for Progress. The 1967 meeting in Buenos Aires significantly changed the OAS charter.

INTRODUCTION

This list includes the principal files in the Johnson Library that contain material relating to the Alliance for Progress. It is not definitive, however, and researchers should consult with the Library's archivists about other potentially useful files. The guide includes those collections which have been opened for research in part or in whole, and those collections which are currently unprocessed or unavailable. Researchers should also consult the Library's guide to Foreign Economic Policy: Foreign Aid, Food for Peace and Third World Economic Development (Asia, Africa, and Latin America).

NATIONAL SECURITY FILE

This file was the working file of President Johnson's special assistants for national security affairs, McGeorge Bundy and Walt W. Rostow. Documents in the file originated in the offices of Bundy and Rostow and their staffs, in the various executive departments and agencies, especially those having to do with foreign affairs and national defense, and in diplomatic and military posts around the world. More than one-half of the National Security File has been processed. Consult the finding aid in the Reading Room or borrow a lending copy by writing to the Supervisory Archivist, LBJ Library, 2313 Red River Street, Austin, Texas 78705. Those folders whose titles are preceded by an asterisk "*" or a date have been processed and their contents declassified in whole or in part. Lists of classified documents have been placed in those folders, and you may request mandatory review of individual documents that have not yet been declassified in full. Those folders not preceded by an "*" or a date are unprocessed and are not subject to mandatory declassification review. Consult with a member of the staff on the processing schedule.
