INTRODUCTION

This list includes the principal files in the Johnson Library that contain material relating to international education. WHITE HOUSE CENTRAL FILES (WHCF)

This permanent White House office was the main filing unit during the Johnson presidency, though not the primary file for foreign policy documents. Material was filed under 60 major subject headings, several of which are pertinent to international education.
