MATERIAL AT THE LBJ LIBRARY PERTAINING TO **GEORGE BALL**

INTRODUCTION

This list includes the principal files in the Johnson Library that contain material relating to George Ball. It is not definitive, however, and researchers should consult with the Library's archivists about other potentially useful files. The guide includes those collections that have been opened for research in part or in whole, and those collections that are currently unprocessed or unavailable.

Material by and about George Ball is located in many other files, especially those dealing with issues in which Ball was actively involved, such as NATO and the Vietnam War. For suggestions of files to consult, see the "List of Materials Available for Research on the Vietnam War" and the "List of Suggested Materials on Western Europe and NATO in the National Security File and the Oral History Collection." Similar lists are available on other subjects

WHITE HOUSE CENTRAL FILES NAME FILE

This file serves as a name index to the Subject File. Name Files, in general, contain copies of the first page of documents (used as cross references) filed in the Subject Files. Request files by name of individual or organization. There is a card file in the Reading Room card catalogue indicating those Name Files that are already available for research.

WHITE HOUSE CENTRAL FILES CONFIDENTIAL FILE

Arranged in the same subject categories as the WHCF Subject File, this file contains security classified or otherwise sensitive material. The CF Name File serves as a name index to the CF Subject File. This collection also includes agency reports and oversize attachments. The CF is entirely processed, but portions are still classified.

John Macy was the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission. As a "talent scout" he maintained a file on all persons considered for appointments. These folders are reviewed on written request. NATIONAL SECURITY FILE

This file was the working file of President Johnson's special assistants for national security affairs, McGeorge Bundy and Walt W. Rostow. Documents in the file originated in the offices of Bundy and Rostow and their staffs, in the various executive departments and agencies, especially those having to do with foreign affairs and national defense, and in diplomatic and military posts around the world. More than one-half of the National Security File has been processed. Consult the finding aid in the Reading Room or borrow a lending copy by writing to the Supervisory Archivist, LBJ Library, 2313 Red River Street, Austin, Texas 78705. Those folders whose titles are preceded by an asterisk "*" or a date have been processed and their contents declassified in whole or in part. Lists of classified documents have been placed in those folders, and you may request mandatory review of individual documents that have not yet been declassified in full. Those folders not preceded by an "*" or a date are possibly unprocessed and are not subject to mandatory declassification review. Consult with a member of the staff on the processing schedule.

are included. The first folder in box 40 contains an annotated list of all the documents in the NSC History.

This chronologically arranged series consists of memoranda (with attachments) to the President from his national security advisers, McGeorge Bundy (11/63 – 2/66) and Walt W. Rostow (4/66 – 1/69). Material pertaining to Ball is scattered throughout the folders for 1964-66. Bundy's file, located in Boxes 1-6, has been processed and a fair amount of the Material – including most of the material on Vietnam—has been declassified. Boxes 7-10 of Rostow's file. Which cover the period from April 1966 to Septembert 1966, when Ball resigned form the State Department, have been processed, and most of the material has been declassified

This collection includes notes for close to 120 meetings that President Johnson held with his senior civilian and military foreign policy advisers during 1967 and 1968, including 45 Tuesday luncheons. <u>W. Thomas Johnson, who took the notes, has retained his copyright in these notes,</u> but they are open for research.

In addition, the collection includes notes for more than 80 meetings that President Johnson held with House and Senate leaders, correspondents, his Cabinet, the National Security Council, businessmen, and other groups. These notes are not copyrighted.

APPOINTMENT FILES

The <u>Diary Cards</u> in the Reading Room provide an alphabetically arranged name index to the President's appointments. Once the date of an appointment has been determined, check the "Diaries and Logs" finding aid for the number of the appropriate boxes in both the <u>Daily Diary</u> and the President's Appointment File [<u>Diary Backup</u>].

The Daily Diary is a log sheet of appointments and phone calls maintained by the White House secretaries. It has been digitized and is available on the LBJ Library web site.

The Diary Backup contains preparation material, press releases, and schedules for meetings and appointments, as well as some reports and notes from the meeting.

OFFICE FILES OF THE WHITE HOUSE AIDES

Many White House aides maintained office files of their own, separate physically from the rest of the White House Central Files. The files of each aide reflect his or her responsibilities. This list is not definitive, but it does include most pertinent folders in the Aides files. If a folder is not open for research, it will be processed upon request. Researchers should anticipate a delay in receiving this material.

(The term "WHCF Box #" below refers to the White House Central Files Storage Numbers assigned to boxes of material that were sent to White House Central Files in the 1960s. Following the Johnson Administration, the material was put under the jurisdiction of the National Archives and Records Administration and transferred to the LBJ Library, where it was re-boxed and assigned a "NLJ Box #". Please use the NLJ Box # when requesting or referring to a box.)

OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT FILE

Consists mainly of folders on individual Cabinet officials and aides, associates, and friends. Access to these files was strictly controlled by the President, and materials he deemed sensitive were files here.
