MATERIAL AT THE LBJ LIBRARY PERTAINING TO JOHN J. MCCLOY

INTRODUCTION

This list includes the principal files in the Johnson Library that contain material relating to John J. McCloy. It is not definitive, however, and researchers should consult with the Library's archivists about other potentially useful files. The guide includes those collections which have been opened for research in part or in whole, and those collections which are currently unprocessed or unavailable.

John J. McCloy served as the United States Representative to the trilateral negotiations held by the United States, the Federal German Republic and the United Kingdom in 1966 and 1967; as Chairman of the General Advisory Committee on the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency (ACDA), 1961-74; as a member of the Committee on Nuclear Proliferation (Gilpatric Committee), 1964-65; and as member of the Commission to Report on the Assassination of President John F. Kennedy (Warren Commission). Material on McCloy may be scattered in files dealing with the various positions in which he served during the Johnson administration. Consult the guides on the Kennedy assassination, Arms Control and Disarmament, and Western Europe and NATO for further information.

Researchers on foreign policy topics will find the <u>Foreign Relations of the United States</u> useful in their research. This multi-volume series, prepared by the Department of State, presents the official documentary record of major foreign policy decisions of the United States Government; State Department historians conducted extensive research in the holdings of the Johnson Library while preparing it. Volumes covering the Johnson years are published periodically, and copies are shelved in the Reference Section of the Library's book collection.

LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON ARCHIVES 1931-1968

In 1958 the Johnson staff instituted a records management program in the office which included a plan to dispose of noncurrent files. They set up the Lyndon Baines Johnson Archives (LBJA) to house items to be permanently retained rather than scheduled for disposal. Johnson files from the House and Senate period were screened, and selected items and files were moved to the LBJA file. Between 1958 and 1963, the staff continued to add to the file. Occasionally items were added during the White House period. The LBJA consists of four parts: a Congressional File, a Famous Names File, a Selected Names File, and a Subject File.

WHITE HOUSE CENTRAL FILES (WHCF)

This permanent White House office was the main filing unit during the Johnson presidency, though not the primary file for foreign policy documents. Material was filed under 60 major subject headings. For descriptions of the various subject headings, see the finding aid for WHCF.

WHCF NAME FILE

This file serves as a name index to the Subject File. Name Files, in general, contain copies of the first page of documents (used as cross references) filed in the Subject Files. Request files by the name of the individual or the organization of interest. There is a card file in the Reading Room card catalogue indicating those Name Files which are already available for research.

WHCF CONFIDENTIAL FILE

Arranged in the same subject categories as the WHCF Subject File, this file contains security classified or otherwise sensitive material. The CF Name File serves as a name index to the CF Subject File. This collection also includes agency reports and oversize attachments. The CF is entirely processed, but portions are still classified.

NATIONAL SECURITY FILE

This file was the working file of President Johnson's special assistants for national security affairs, McGeorge Bundy and Walt W. Rostow. Documents in the file originated in the offices of Bundy and Rostow and their staffs, in the various executive departments and agencies, especially those having to do with foreign affairs and national defense, and in diplomatic and military posts around the world. More than half of the National Security File has been processed and opened for research. Consult the finding aid in the Reading Room or borrow a lending copy by writing to the Supervisory Archivist, LBJ Library, 2313 Red River Street, Austin, Texas 78705. Those folders whose titles are preceded by an "X" or a date have been processed and their contents declassified in whole or in part. Lists of classified documents have been placed in those folders, and you may request mandatory review of individual documents which have not yet been declassified in full. Those folders not preceded by an "X" or a date are unprocessed and are not subject to mandatory declassification review. Consult with a member of the staff on the processing schedule.

The folders listed below are ones in which specific documents related to John McCloy have been noted either by LBJ Library staff members in the course of processing or ones which have been indexed as part of a private microfilm company's publication. Other material on McCloy will no doubt be found in those parts of the National Security File which contain material relevant to the duties McCloy performed during the Johnson administration. Consult the guides on Western Europe and NATO and on Arms Control and Disarmament for additional information.

APPOINTMENT FILES

The <u>Diary Cards</u> in the Reading Room provide an alphabetically arranged name index to the President's appointments. Once the date of an appointment has been determined, check the "Diaries and Logs" finding aid for the number of the appropriate boxes in both the <u>Daily Diary</u> and the President's Appointment File [<u>Diary Backup</u>].

The Daily Diary is a log sheet of appointments and phone calls maintained by the White House secretaries.

The Diary Backup contains preparation material, press releases, and schedules for meetings and appointments, as well as some reports and notes from the meetings.

OFFICE FILES OF JOHN MACY

John Macy was the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission. As a "talent scout" he maintained a file on all persons considered for appointments. These folders are reviewed on written request. A card file is maintained in the Reading Room for those name files currently available. Researchers should anticipate a delay in receiving this material.

RECORDINGS AND TRANSCRIPTS OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATIONS

The Johnson Library staff is currently processing the recordings and transcripts of President Johnson's telephone conversations. The collection includes over 5,000 recordings of conversations with members of Congress, other public officials, civil rights leaders, members of the press, friends, and family.

JFK assassination-related recordings and transcripts identified by the Library staff from four periods during the administration were opened in increments from September 30, 1993, through April 15, 1994 (please consult the finding aid for that collection for further information). The JFK Assassination Records Collection, located at the National Archives at College Park, 8601 Adelphi Road, College Park, Maryland 20740, has copies of these recordings and transcripts. On October 11, 1996, the Library opened conversations recorded in January through March of 1964 and will open chronological increments of the collection periodically. The unprocessed portion of the collection may include conversations of interest to you which are not included on this guide. If you wish to be notified when additional recordings and transcripts are released, please contact the Library.

Many of the recordings were **NOT TRANSCRIBED**. The transcripts that were made were prepared in the White House and during the drafting of the President's memoirs, <u>The Vantage Point</u>, published in 1971. Researchers should be cautioned that these transcripts are not always reliable and should never be used without checking them against the actual recordings to assure accuracy.
